Project Development History

- 2019: EWC drafts a proposal for a 4 year,
 \$12m solo project: Pacific Good Governance
 Initiative
- 2020: EWC revises PGGI and collaborates with SPC, IFES and CARE on 5 year, \$20m PROJECT Governance.
- ProGov proposal centers around SPC as principal, EWC, IFES and CARE adding expertise in independent, complementary roles
